

Basic Gameplay

Water polo is a team sport played in a pool with a goal at each end. The object of the game is to score goals by throwing the ball into the opposing team's goal. The game is played with a six-player team in the pool at a time, with each team having an additional seven players on the bench.

Fouls

Penalty shots are awarded when a foul is committed within the six-meter area. The player who was fouled is awarded a penalty shot from the five-meter line.

The player who is taking the penalty shot must shoot the ball directly at the goal. The goalkeeper is allowed to block the shot, but he cannot leave his crease.

If the penalty shot is successful, the team that was awarded the penalty shot is awarded one goal.

Rule Changes for the 2024-22 Season

The following are the most significant rule changes for the 2024-22 NFHS water polo season:

- The use of video replay is now allowed to review certain calls, such as goals and penalty shots.
- The definition of a foul has been clarified to include any contact that is unnecessary or excessive.
- The penalty for a major foul has been increased from two minutes to three minutes.
- The number of timeouts that each team is allowed to take has been reduced from three to two.




