
The Tragedy of Navy SEAL Chris Sajnog: A Life Ended By Miscommunication



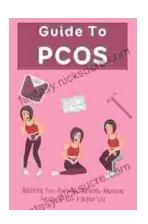

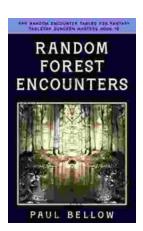
